The incumbent is responsible for managing, developing and implementing policies with the objective of ensuring that all Manitobans receive professional, effective, consistent policing based on standards set out in The Police Services Act. Within the parameters of assigned authority, the incumbent will represent the Department on working groups, and provide collaborative options and recommendations to key stakeholder groups and government on policing and public safety matters.
