### POSITION SUMMARY

The Special Constable position will assist the police organization in successfully meeting its' vision of community wellness through creating partnerships, linkages, and integration of services for both offenders and victims. The Special Constable will also participate in community/educational events throughout the UCCM communities. This position is also responsible for the safe and secure transport of offenders between correctional institutions and court locations so that the UCCM Anishnaabe Police will meet its organizational obligations under the UCCM-Wikwemikong-OPP Offender Transportation Program.

- Create linkages and integration with other community partners by making referrals to appropriate service agencies for services outside the initial scope of law enforcement;
- Participate and assist with the planning, coordination and delivery of proactive safety and education campaigns and programs;
- Participate in community safety partner campaigns and education initiatives as requested by community event organizers: includes representing the Service in cultural events such as pow-wow gatherings, memorial tributes and other similar functions;
- Offender Transportation: Ensure the care, custody and control of offenders in court and police holding cells; transport persons in police custody to/from correctional institutions to court facilities in accordance with policy and training (e.g., handcuffing, shackling, and searching of offenders);
- Process serving: serve incoming/outgoing subpoenas; deliver court related documents for disclosure, processing as needed;
- Other duties/responsibilities as maybe assigned
